I'd like to take a moment to reflect on my first year in the role of Club Captain and what has stood out to me from my time on the committee. Firstly, it has been a busy year for the committee with many activities underway from fundraising for the lights on the tennis courts to developing a new constitution for the club. There are also constant considerations of repairs and maintenance, health and safety and revenue, to name only a few of the items we cover. The committee considers and works through them all with the best outcome for the club always front and centre of any decisions made. I'd like to acknowledge the effort, and care that the committee has in its commitment to always work in the best interests of the club. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes, that we may not always be aware of as members.

Secondly, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Charlotte Bell, in particular, for her ongoing support and mentorship while I come to grips with this role. It has been hugely beneficial to have Charlotte's wisdom and experience to call on from her years as Club Captain. She has left a huge footprint to fill and I still have a long way to go, to do justice to the legacy Charlotte has created – thank you so much Charlotte.

I'm looking forward to being involved in the coming year and helping the Club achieve some of the amazing initiatives we have underway. Below are some highlights from the last twelve months as well as some other updates that may be of interest and will change the way things are done going forward as Tennis New Zealand implements changes to modernise the way tennis is managed in New Zealand, that will keep us current with what is happening internationally in the world of tennis.



#### **Tennis Club Championships**



Our Club Champs ran over two weekends with the preliminary rounds played on 6 and 7 April and the semifinals and finals played on Saturday 13 and Sunday 14 April. The weather was perfect for spectators to watch some excellent matches on the courts. Thank you very much to everyone who participated. The calibre of tennis was impressive and I hope everyone enjoyed themselves. Thank you, Charlotte and Phil, for organising and coordinating all

the matches over the two weekends – it was a huge effort.


We are thinking of adding a Seniors/ Masters category for next year (for those players of a certain age and above  $\mathfrak{S}$ ). It would be great to hear your thoughts on whether this is a good idea. You'll still be able to enter the open grade, but it will give members who may not otherwise play, an opportunity to join in the fun.

I'll also be looking to start junior and senior club ladders in the clubrooms for interest and for players to challenge themselves to improve their ranking.

#### Let there be light on the tennis courts!

A major project for the club and a long-term investment that began over 5 years ago, is the installation of lights on the tennis courts to prolong playing time. The benefits of the addition of lights will be immeasurable to the club. We hit the first milestone when Wellington City Council gave consent for the installation of lights for the tennis courts. A subgroup was set up to obtain quotes and lead the fundraising activities to make this happen.

The cost to install the lights is approx. \$198,000. The total cost for the lights and to have the courts resurfaced and for acoustic engineering services is \$235,702.86. So far, we have raised



\$80,000 through fundraising activities, grants and sponsorship. There is still more to do and we need your support to make this happen. Please reach out to Charlotte Bell or me, if you

have any fundraising ideas or know anyone who may be willing to support the club, or would like to be involved to "turn on the lights". This will definitely be a team effort!

This is a huge opportunity for the club that will benefit all the members by increasing playing time by several hours after dark throughout the year. The addition of lights will make tennis a year-round sport (weather permitting), instead of only being a summer-season sport during daylight hours. This will increase our offerings to our members and our local community as well as keeping us competitive for attracting new memberships.

#### Interclub Rating System Change - World Tennis Number

Starting at the beginning of September 2025, Tennis New Zealand will officially adopt the ITF World Tennis Number (WTN) as the new national ratings system for all Interclub competitions nationwide.

The transition from the MatchHub S&D rating system to the new platform is intended to provide the best possible framework for players to enjoy, improve, and benchmark their skills. The WTN is a global rating system developed by the International Tennis Federation (ITF). It provides a unified rating for all players regardless of age, gender, or playing level, from beginners to elite athletes.

## **Tennis Coaching Report**

David Knight, Head Tennis Coach

Two of my core philosophies as a coach are that:

- i) the person comes before the player and
- ii) participation precedes performance.

When I reflect on these, it is the coaches I work alongside at Island Bay who demonstrate this best. Of the 100 + tennis players accessing our coaching services at Island Bay over 2024-25, it is our group of coaches who often become the main contact point or connection to the Club. These could initially be four year olds getting their first taste of the sport through patience driven twenty minute private lessons or red stage Hot Shots groups, right through to retirees refinding their love for the game through our Rusty groups.

Many of the coaches who work at the Club are people who I seriously admire for their people skills and leadership as opposed to their killer backhands or daunting kick serves. I've had the pleasure of coaching many of them myself (a handful for over half their lives)! I believe in them as people and their ability to walk the next group of budding tennis players through the gates of the club and on a journey that can be so challenging but also build so much in terms of character. The skills of self-sufficiency, problem-solving, honesty and resilience are built organically through our sport and this is reflected in each of you. So, to Kate Bolton, Alice Bolton, Ayla Giesen, Jeremy Guy, Lucy Skogstad, Ary Bhawan, Gracie Aitken, Samuel Podmore, Amber Lyons, Tom Bolton and Maddie Petersen; THANKS so much for inspiring and bringing enthusiasm to what you do. Although I'm particularly passionate about performance level tennis coaching, I'm even more proud of seeing the responsible leaders that some of you have become and I'm fully aware that any performance work is only a layer on top of tonnes of groundwork that happens first. The reality of attempting to run a small business across a long coaching pathway is that it requires a strong team effort.

Although summer can be fantastic, writing this in the middle of winter is tough, but again, makes me reflect on both the members and coaches who are willing to persevere to keep our sport going with a realistic coaching window of two hours after school (light) and wet courts approximately 50% of the time (term two was a shocker!). Thanks so much to those who have grabbed a squeegee, done footwork lessons inside or are willing to train in the middle of the weekend or at other facilities so we can keep in operation. It is during these times that we all learn things that aren't necessarily in the coaching manual! The determination, adaptability and positive perspectives of both players and coaches do not go unnoticed.

I think these outlooks are critical to making Clubs go forward. We are in a constantly evolving and challenging battle to attract people to Club sports programmes (or sport in general) and it takes special characters to drive the innovation that makes things happen and broadens our offerings to the community. From where I sit, a massive thanks goes to the Bells who continue to selflessly drive projects which are for the better of tennis. I think one of the greatest tennis lessons of all can be taught to someone willing to persevere against a hitting wall. Additionally, in the past year Liz Clement has taken on Junior Convener and Adele Plummer has taken a lead with some of the grants' work for the lights project - the work of you both is much appreciated and apologies if you didn't foresee this level of responsibility when your kids joined the club for lessons! ## Infrastructure and Maintenance

#### Gerard Elkink, Vice President

The past year has been about maintaining what we already have. Whilst not very exciting to look at, the results of this work nevertheless represent a lot of work on the part of the people looking after them and they deserve our sincere thanks.

#### **Tennis Court lights**

Provision of lighting for the tennis courts is our biggest and only ongoing project at the moment. This is mainly about fundraising to a point where we can start installation.

Our resource consent allows 4 more years to get started.

#### Roof

The roof over the Services Club is also the observation deck. There has been some deterioration of the surface and it requires application of new traffic guard. This work is under action by BNU as part of their agreement to assist with maintenance.

The preparation work has flagged some problems of potential rot in the window frames which will need to be kept under observation.

#### **Tennis Gate**

With the Hello Club entry system working well, the gate showed up as the weak link in controlling entry for tennis players. This is to be addressed by installation of some sheet metal on both the gate and the latch. This should prevent people trying to by-pass the tag system by putting their hands through the gap to unlock it manually.

#### Water Issues

A couple of months ago, days before we were hosting a squash tournament, the showers stopped working. Investigations revealed that the header tank on the roof had never been properly installed and finally stopped feeding water to the hot water cylinder. The system was repaired so that the showers were working, but a long-term solution is still required. This will possibly require a different H/W cylinder, and even a shift from gas to electricity for heating the water. The committee will need to consider the costs and benefits of all the options.

In conclusion, business as usual for the past year. Thanks to all committee and club members who put in the work in ensuring that our facilities are up to scratch.

## Bar and Social

### Dayne Far, Bar Manager

The bar continues to be able to provide a diverse range of choices to members and visitors to the club; thanks to strong patronage from club members, visitors and BNU. If you're looking for a venue to host a private event, remember that the club is an option. Just reach out to me if you wish to make any enquiries.

As a general reminder to members, please remember that the bar is for all members. So, keeping the bar tidy and fridges stocked should be everyone's responsibility. If you're using the bar, please remember to turn the glass washer on when you open the bar so any glasses can be put through it before you leave. It only takes a couple of minutes to run the cycle, so if you're unsure please ask someone. Also, if you can have a quick look and restock the fridges while you are there it would mean that members coming in after you aren't greeted with an empty fridge. It only takes a few minutes to do and ensures that we are actually making proper use of our stock. Note that product should not be tucked up against the single door fridge as this restricts airflow. Any excess stock should be by the gap in-between the door and the main fridge, or in the cupboards underneath the sink.

PayWave has become the main payment at the club, with the majority of bar purchases utilising this method now. The Commerce Commission are currently reviewing fees on transactions, and we hope that these will be reduced or abolished. At this stage we haven't made any changes to this as we are awaiting the outcome of the Commerce Commission review.

Our partnership with Double Vision Brewing (as part of my desire to support local breweries) has been a good one so far, as they provide competitive pricing and great service in terms of deliveries. I was hoping to get them down to the club for the Island Bay Open, but they were about to open the DVB Hub, so the timing didn't work out. They've also just recently been named the official beer for WOAP 2025 which is great to see support for a local brewery. I'm still hopeful of getting them along soon and seeing if we can't engage in some events at the club. As they've been great for the club, I'd highly recommend you get down and support them at either DVB Hub Island Bay (163 The Parade) or over in their original locale in Miramar (128A Unit E, Park Road).

There are also still upgrades that the bar needs with a new fridge and glass washer the highest priorities. We now have a new iPad running Spotify and a speaker for music. We also have some mics to get the Karaoke going – we just need a screen now for the lyrics! The iPad/speaker setup is currently situated outside the bar so that it can be used by any

members. I just ask members not to install other programs/use it for other purposes. If it is misused, then it'll get removed or turned into a kiosk (like the Helloclub computer downstairs which only has a singular purpose).

We have now instigated Servewise requirements for bar access as required under our bar licence with WCC. If you would like to have bar access, you need to complete the Servewise qualification and send through the certificate to me and I can arrange access. It takes about an hour, but really helps us all keeping the bar open. The bar now has whiteboards to indicate people on site that have the qualification. Note that it is a licence requirement that we have a minimum of 1 Servewise qualified person on the premises (and not on the courts) for the bar to be open.

From a purely financial perspective, total revenue from the bar in 2024 was \$49,781.80. BNU contributed \$21,075.50, squash tournaments contributed \$7,744.50 and we took in over \$2,900 in Jan/Feb – largely contributed by those who helped out doing the squash court painting. We only had a couple of private functions last year which contributed around \$1,800. We're hoping to improve on that in the 2025 year, and have a couple of big functions coming up in September/October.

BNU is a vital component to the success of the bar; and their patronage gives us the ability to offer arguably the best selection of drinks in any club bar in Wellington. BNU figures evidence they've brought in the equivalent of 32/44/31 tennis members (or 23/32/23 squash members) in relation to their profits over the past 3 years. So they're a significant contributor to the club, and I think most people who have been in the bar while they've been there would agree they bring a lot of energy and atmosphere to the place.

If there's anything you'd like to see from the bar, or if you'd like to help out with the bar and/or functions just reach out and ask.

Separate document with more details sent out with the second AGM notice on 11<sup>th</sup> August. Noted increased insurance costs is affecting clubs and businesses all over the country. Can discuss more in other business.
- 6. **Membership report** by club manager Renee Bell, club membership is down by 20%. The average decrease across Wellington tennis and squash clubs is of 11 %. Family membership is the biggest loss but this can also be a change of membership types, family becoming an adult and a junior. Also we have had a high youth turnover, but this is not new, youth moving out of the area.
- 7. **Questions on other reports in the annual report.** No questions asked.
- 8. **Election on officers.** Lauren Wash has stood down as Committee secretary so that role is vacant, however she will remain on the committee. Treasurer, Paul Hodder has agreed to stay on for another year. Charlotte Bell has stood down as tennis club captain. The

- Committee are appreciative of all her hard work and Helen Mackay also recognised Charlotte
  and her family's dedication and hard work in her role as club captain over the last few years.
   Christina Vellasamy was welcomed into the role as tennis club captain.
- 10. **Committee members**. Mike Chung nominated Rob McDonald and Brianna See as Committee members. Agreed by members present. Welcome.

#### 11. In remembrance, 2024

- PH, spoke about the late Dave Sercombe, active club member, great family man, tricky and clever tennis player. He will be missed.
- MC, spoke about Steve Riley, an active member, remembered for his kind and gentle nature.
   With his family's blessing and to honour Steve's memory squashies would like to donate tournament proceeds to the Mental Health foundation.

#### 12. Other business

Further discussion of insurance, Paul assured members we are insured until the end of June 25, we insured for indemnity only \$2,094,000, at a cost of \$29, 600. If we were to not have any club insurance, members reassured there would be a special meeting called.

Only 2 suppliers in the county.

Question asked if we increased excess would there be a difference in premium, no.

Queries. Do we need to cover for earthquake and tsunami? Sports clubs would not be a priority if there was a major disaster, hospitals, schools would be top priority. Recognised that other clubs only have fire cover.

Highlighted that some Christchurch sports clubs are only getting back to business, after their major earthquake.

Choices, insurance pot in the club accounts to be used to replace facilities, may look different to what we have now, i.e. single level clubrooms will be significantly cheaper.

Assured there is no WCC requirement for us to have insurance but we will need to keep them informed and any discussions on insurance must continue to include the Services club who pay 20% of the annual premium.

Plan either in 2025, January or Feb hold a special meeting, in hope that nationally insurance costs decrease, all members will be invited.

Committee will continue to inform members and look at options on what we insurance we may be able to reduce our current cover. Review what is happening other clubs nationwide.

HM expressed support and confidence, in committee to make the right decision on our club's insurance position moving forward.
